The attention of the Director of Treasuries and Accounts, A.P., Hyderabad is invited to the reference cited, and he is informed that in all those cases where an in-service employee who was covered under the earlier pension rules joins another organization / Department where the same rules were applicable, after submitting a technical resignation, such employees will be treated outside the purview of New Contributory Pension Scheme. In other words, they would continue to remain under the earlier pension rules. In those cases, where past service was not covered under the earlier pension rules and or such services are not counted for pensionary other recruitment benefit, the concerned employees may be treated to be covered under the New Pension Scheme.

Subject: Pension – New Contributory Pension Scheme introduced by State Government w.e.f. 01.09.2004 on the pattern of Govt. of India. Applicability to in-service employees / Teachers who are subsequently recruited through APPSC / DSCs.

Dear Madam,

Please refer to your letter NO. 2595-A/50/A2/Pen.I/2005 dated 18.02.2005 on the above mentioned subject. On the issue raised in your letter, it may be stated that the practice being adopted in Central Government is that in all those cases where an in-service employee who was covered under the earlier pension rules (DB Scheme) joins another organization / Department where the same rules were applicable after submitting a technical resignation, such employee will be treated outside the purview of New Contributory Pension Scheme. In other words, they would continue to remain under the earlier pension rules. In those cases, where, past service was not covered under the earlier pension rules and or such services are not counted for pensionary other recruitment benefit, the concerned employees may be treated to be covered under the New Pension Scheme.

However, before a final decision is taken in this regard, Finance Department is requested to get the issue clarified by the Personnel Department also in light of the prevailing rules for the Andhra Pradesh State employees.
